Foundation Executive Director's Report

Over the past year, the Foundation has stayed the course of its strategic plan, while working through a pandemic to achieve the required results striving to meet the needs of the College, Community and Students. We completed our third campaign in seven years, achieving our goal of \$4 million dollars for the Center for Science and Technology on the Central Community College-Columbus Campus.

Most of the events scheduled, such as our employee campaign, pro-am golf event, and the Rotary student recognition luncheon were strongly supported by donors and sponsors. Alumni development is moving forward with over 20,000 alumni in our database, with tracking in place to assist the funding of scholarships and programs at CCC. We know our alumni will step up and continue to make a difference. Collectively, the book of work for the Foundation is Making a Lasting Impression on the College, Community and Students of CCC.

During the past year, the Foundation has spent a considerable amount of time to re-engineer and develop a new direction for the Entrepreneurship Center. Working with CCC to hire a new regional entrepreneurship director has been key, along with becoming proactive with the Capital Loan Fund, which provided capital for three new businesses during the pandemic.

We are now embarking on a new Planned Giving campaign to address our endowment funds, with respect to administrative support and scholarships. The *Generations of Impact* project has already completed a feasibility study with excellent results. The College and Foundation are well positioned for this project. Although the goal has not been set, we've tested at a significant level of interest as we get closer to the beginning of the project. Upon being successful over the next few years, we will solidify the CCC Foundation's financial position. The intention is to endow 100% of the operating expenses of the Foundation, so that every dollar, going forward, goes toward scholarships, programs and possibly priority capital items. Making a Lasting Impression is the goal, and we're right on track to deliver long term.

Planned Giving

The Central Community College Foundation has met with numerous donors over the years regarding planned gifts, with the intention to leave a legacy and make a lasting impression. The Central Community College Foundation (CCCF) and its consultant conducted a feasibility study during April and May of 2021, to test whether CCCF should launch a proposed \$25 million fundraising project. This campaign would be on behalf of Central Community College (CCC) for the purpose of endowing a *Generations of Impact* fund, as well as student scholarships, program advancements and investments in technology. The annual interest earned from the endowment would provide support for operational expenses of the Foundation. Once fully endowed, this campaign will allow future donations to have an even greater impact on generations of future CCC students, the workforce and our communities.

Entrepreneurship Centers

Small businesses represent a high percentage of all employers and are critically important to the ongoing growth of our community and country. In 1990, the CCC Foundation received specific donations, micro loan funds, and grants to establish the Small Business Institute to encourage the formation of new small businesses and to assist existing small businesses with growth opportunities. In 2020, the Small Business Institute (SBI) was rebranded the Entrepreneurship Center.

The Entrepreneurship Center is an integral part of the CCC Foundation and CCC. It is under the direction of a board of directors and staffed by directors in Columbus and Hastings.

Business and Startup Coaching

CCC's Entrepreneurship Center offers a variety of services for individuals and companies looking for technical or financial assistance in starting or growing their business. The Entrepreneurship Center offers coaching for small business and startup owners, including business planning, financial packaging, and more. Normally, there is no charge for the coaching services.

Workshops, Seminars and Other Events to Educate and Promote Business Ownership

Workshops, seminars and other events are offered to educate and promote business ownership in the communities that it serves. The rewards of being your own boss are great, but so are the challenges. If you want to own your own business, we offer entrepreneurship education to help you develop the skills needed to get started. You can learn about opportunity analysis, marketing, finance, tax and legal issues, and even develop a business plan.

Incubator Space

The Entrepreneurship Center has a small business incubator in Hastings and Columbus. The main purpose of the incubator is to provide space at an affordable rate for new small business startups and/or for small business owners who wish to grow and expand. The incubator serves as a launching pad for businesses until they are able to graduate to a market-rate location or outgrow the space.

Capital Loan Fund

Entrepreneurs who may require financial help with startup costs or cash infusion for growth may apply for a low-interest loan at the Entrepreneurship Center through the Capital Loan Fund. A client may receive up to \$20,000 through the loan fund. Loans are reviewed and approved by a board of directors. The Capital Loan Fund is housed within the Central Community College Foundation.

College-Wide Support Options

Adult Education: Funds are used to support Adult Education classes.

Alumni Heritage Endowed Scholarship: Second-year students of CCC are eligible for this scholarship funded by donations from CCC Alumni.

Karen Baird Memorial Scholarship: Scholarship for a student who is involved in volunteering in a community within the 25-county area.

Black Hills Energy Scholarship: Scholarships to students enrolled in HVAC, gas utility, welding, manufacturing or like program. Student must have a 3.0 GPA and preference is given to students living in communities served by Black Hills Energy who demonstrate leadership and community involvement.

Bosselman Family Scholarship: Scholarship given to students in Automotive, Truck Driving, Advanced Manufacturing, or Welding.
